ElectricAid Moffice 2 Update	Mary Kavanagh delivered the ElectricAid Key Performance Indices for January 2021:  There were fifteen fundings across thirteen countries with a total value of €180,275.  There are 1,257 staff donors and 995 pensioner donors.  The value of monthly staff donations has fallen off slightly while the monthly pensioner donations has stayed steady.  Outstanding Reports:  2017, 7 reports with a value of €47,580	

2018. 8 reports with a value of €55,829 2019, 33 reports with a value of €295,811.

The ElectricAid office recommends time with Evalco to review and update onboarding new applicants or applicants who haven't applied in more than two years.

## Finance Group Report

Hilary Boyse reported on behalf of the Finance group:

The ElectricAid accounts at year-end 2020 show that income is at €1,083,539 (up from €1,070,673 in 2019) while expenditure is at €1,064,400 (€1,141,985 in 2019)

Overall, the accounts are in line with expectation. The only exception was that tax receipts were €10,000 higher than forecast which is a very positive outcome for ElectricAid.

Hilary Boyse advised that the year-end financial accounts are now due to be prepared for audit

There were two write-backs proposed. These payments were approved in July 2020 subject to additional information being received. As at January 2021 this additional information has not yet been received from either charity. Given the time lapse that has evolved, Hilary Boyse was seeking agreement to write back to enable funds to be released for other projects.

Joe Lawlor proposed that it should be captured in our policy that no more than two funding periods elapse before write-back and this was accepted unanimously.

Evalco assessed 20 applications seeking a combined total of €233,964 in funding. Treasurer guidance of €200,000 was advised.

The Committee recommends 15 applications for funding totalling €180,275 Funding reached 12 different countries and geographic spread remains focused on African countries with 13 projects funded. 1 in Asia and 1 in Central America. 9 projects were funded in full, 6 in part.

5 projects were rejected and none deferred.
